I. APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

- 1. Trustee Richeson made a motion to approve minutes 25-04 for February 19, 2025. Trustee Ashoff seconds. Roll call vote, all in favor, motion passed.
- 2. Trustee Richeson made a motion to approve the agenda 25-05 for March 5, 2025. Trustee Schnidt seconds. Roll call vote, all in favor, motion passed.

A. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT/HEALTH:

- 1. Trustee Elliott was not present.
- 2. Trustee Schmidt made a motion to Establish a BBQ Committee and open a separate banking account for the committee. Trustee Gavlick seconds. Roll call vote all in favor, motion passed.
- 3. Trustee Gavlick made a motion to approve the appointment of Zach Mason, Matt Streif, Zach Heidrich and Nathan Schmidt. Roll call vote, 4 ayes and Trustee Schmidt abstain, motion passed.

B. WATER AND SEWER:

- 1. Trustee Ashoff, tabled water storage & booster station.
- 2. Trustee Ashoff made a motion to approve Ordinance 25-638 to amend the shut-off fees. Trustee Richeson second. Discussion ensued, Trustee Ashoff amended approval with the changes of the ordinance title and the reconnect after hours of being between 7am to 3pm Monday through Friday. If a resident request to be turned back on after those hours there will be a \$200 fee to do so. Trustee Richeson seconds. Roll call vote, all in favor, motion passed.
- 3. Vac trailer tabled.
- 4. Discussion ensued regarding First Cable's unauthorized usage of hydrants for water. Attorney Craney stated that there could be local, state or even federal charges filed for the offenses. A representative from First Cable apologized and stated that they used a meter with a backflow preventor, and they usually work with American Water and use hydrants for the water. There was a discrepancy in the amount of water the village says they used and the amount they say they used. The board to discuss in closed session.

C. POLICE:

1. Trustee Ross reported the Chief's report. On 2/22/25 a Madison Co Sheriff's deputy took reports of 1 stolen vehicle with the keys inside from Dakotah Dr, it was recovered in Berkley, MO. Currency totaling \$2,800 in an unlocked vehicle burglary on Olyvia, and 2 credit cards from an unlocked vehicle on W. 5th St.

A 9mm pistol that was stolen from a vehicle on Irene last year was recovered in Quincy, IL. There were no tickets or fines collected.

- 2. Trustee Gavlick made a motion to approve the proposal from Loy Tally Miller for fiscal year audit in the amount of \$10,925. Trustee Richeson seconds. Roll call vote, all in favor, motion passed.

- 1. Trustee Gavlick made a motion to approve the start of the purchase of 1900 ft of fencing for the back field behind the maintenance shed not to exceed \$24,228.61. Trustee Schmidt seconds. Roll call vote, all in favor, motion passed.
- 2. Trustee Schmidt made a motion to approve the quotes from C.A.V.I. for cameras to be installed at Village Hall, Sewer plant and the fuel tanks and gate not to exceed \$7,500. Trustee Gavlick seconds. Roll call vote, all in favor, motion passed.
- 3. Trustee Richeson made a motion to approve applying for the Madison County PEP grant. Trustee Schmidt seconds. Roll call vote, all in favor, motion passed.

- 1. Trustee Richeson stated they had a committee meeting, and he made a motion to approve the street closures for the Fall Fest 2025 on September 27th. Trustee Schmidt seconds. Roll call vote, all in favor, motion passed.
